

First, TAG interview with your name, narrator's name, today's date, time, and location.

Ex: My name is [interviewer's name] and I am conducting an oral history interview with [narrator's name] on [date] at [time] in [location (city, state/province)].

This interview is being conducted as part of the Sindhi Voices Project.

-When were you born? What is your age?

(If the narrator does not know the answer to this question ask him or her if they remember how old they were at the time of Partition or at their wedding and how long they have been married.)

-Where were you born? What is the village/city, state, and country *(If the narrator does not know the answer to this question ask him or her the earliest place they remember living in.)*

Some statements questions you can ask to continue the interview:

-Tell me about your parents.

-Describe your childhood.

-Describe your childhood home.

-Tell me your life story. (since this is very broad, you could break this up into momentous occasions: schooling, deaths, travels, first job, marriages, children)

-Tell me about a typical day in your childhood.

-Tell me about a typical day of yours before Partition.

-Tell me about a typical day after Partition. (If/how did your life change?)

-How did you end up in the place you live in today?

-Tell me about the most important moments in your life.

- What aspects of your identity most important?

-What are your thoughts on the way relations between people from different communities (religious, linguistic, class, etc.) have changed throughout your own life?

Ask your own questions throughout the interview that are related to the unique stories that the narrator is telling.

-Ask the person to describe things in detail- as if you could be there (or something)
